President Avera called for approval of the minutes of the previous meeting. Michael Bailey moved to accept them as written and Frank Seidule seconded the motion. The motion was passed.

Russell Dart gave a report on the state meeting. The new president will be Mike Ratcliff and the new state secretary will be Ron Brown.

Frank Seidule gave a report on the Color Guard meeting that he attended at the state meeting. One of the recommendations suggested was to give a challenge coin to people who participate in the color guards, ROTC, etc. Challenge coins cost \$10.00 each.

Michael Bailey made a motion to purchase 10 challenge coins to be given out by the Color Guard. Donald Mudd, second the motion. Motion carried.

Ray Beall gave a report on the cost of uniforms for future color guard members. Michael Bailey made a motion that the SAR Cradle of Texas contribute \$300.00 from the McAlexander Fund for each of three individual uniforms. Russell Dart seconded the motion. Motion carried. Michael Bailey donated \$13.00 to the McAlexander fund to bring the balance to \$900.00.

The *Brazosport Facts* (Southern Brazoria County newspaper) published the story on Jim Guillen receiving the EMS Medal at the February meeting.

Bill Sanders gave a report that he has 28 SAR applications including Eastland, Wiggins, and Weems. He also reported that on April 20, 2016, the Wharton Historical Society will visit the 1897 cemetery in Louise, Texas.

NEW BUSINESS: Douglas Harris Rhodenbaugh was inducted into the SAR by Bill Sanders. His mother (Mary Ruth Rhodenbaugh-DAR member) pinned the rosette on her son. Douglas' sister, Molly Marie Molenaar, nephew,

The colors of the rosette match those of the uniform of General George Washington and the Continental Army. Mr. Rhodenbaugh, an Austin I.S.D. teacher, emphasized that it is very important that we continue to educate the youth on the American ideals and

morals as they are the future leaders of tomorrow.

PROGRAM: Cynthia Ericson gave an excellent legal chronology on the life of Clyde Thompson, "The Meanest Man in Texas". Thompson killed his first man when he was 17 years old and killed three more while in prison. His sentence of execution for the first murder was commuted to life. Later he was sentenced to three life terms for the other murders. While in solitary confinement, he began reading the Bible for the first time and became a born-again Christian. He started the first prison ministry in Texas and was eventually pardoned and released.



Ms. Ericson is a graduate of Columbia High School, She was named Brazoria County Fair Queen, and her escort, Hector Ward, was honored with the James Massey Award. She attended Texas A&M University, where she was a member of the Corps of Cadets, the Ross Volunteers, Parsons Mounted Cavalry, and the Corps Center Guard. She served as Deputy Corps Commander and was commissioned a PATRIOT Missile officer in the US Army. After the Army, she Tulane graduated from University School of Law and she is now a proud employee of the District Attorney in Brazoria County. Cynthia is now

pursuing a Masters in Anthropology at the University of Houston with Dr. Kenneth R. Brown with whom she is studying the Levi Jordan Plantation.
