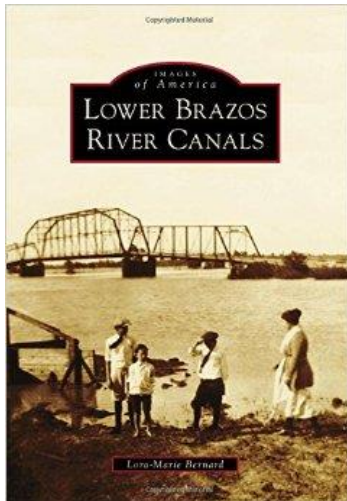

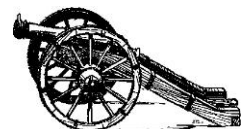
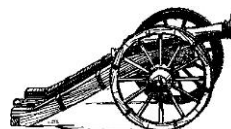

MEETING MINUTES

May 9, 2015

President Bailey introduced our guest speaker Texas State Society of SAR President Larry Steven and his wife, Barbara. Larry is the one hundred one (101) State TXSSAR President and he has been an SAR member for 28 years. He introduced many of the different uniforms used by the Continental Army during the American Revolution. General Washington ordered regular soldiers wear blue coats with different colored lapels. His close officers and personal guards dressed as he did, blue coat and gold trousers. Artillery units wore red uniforms.



Larry announced that Barbara will be running for president of the Texas DAR this year.

The minutes were presented for approval with corrections to dates in the Treasurer's report. George Easterling moved to accept them as written and with corrections and Russell Dart seconded the motion. Minutes were approved.

President Bailey reported that Treasurer Arthur Evans' report had not transactions for the month of April.
