BOBBY GERVAIS

Bobby Gervais was born in Thibodaux, Louisiana. He is a direct descendant of a French plantation-owning family in St. Domingue (now Haiti), who had to flee to Louisiana due to a slave revolt on the island.

At age six his father took a job in Scotland and he lived there until

returning to the USA at age 13. While growing up in Scotland, Bobby fostered a tremendous love of history, with his childhood being filled with constant visits to castles, battlefields, parliaments and museums.

In returning to the America, he studied at Trinity University in San Antonio on National Merit a Scholarship, majoring in History, Business and German. After that, he studied law at Baylor University School of Law. During his undergraduate studies and law school, he studied abroad in Germany. He spent a summer in Berlin right after the fall of Bobby currently the Berlin Wall. practices law in Manvel, where he serves as the city attorney for the City of Manvel.

For decades Bobby Gervais has been a history buff. Several years ago he became an avid student of the Battle of New Orleans, after discovering that his ancestor who fled from Haiti fought in the Battle alongside Andrew Jackson. His ancestor fought with the French chausseurs under Major Plauche'. He is an active participant in the annual History of the Battle of New Orleans Symposium held every year in Chalmette, Louisiana.

February 9, 2019, The Sons of the American Revolution met February 9, 2019 at the Fat Grass Restaurant, Bay City Texas.

Introduction of Guests: President Rodney Weems introduced our guests:

Program: Paul N. Spellman, PhD – Professor of History at Wharton County Junio College, Richmond Campus.

Dr. Spellman spoke about his research on one of his relatives, Zadock Woods who came to Texas in 1823 as one of the



"Stephen F. Austin's Old 300." Dr. Spellman described his travels from Vermont to Missouri and finally the Alamo in search of documents verifying the history of his ancestor, Zadock

Woods' and documenting Zadock's father as a Patriot of the American Dr. Spellman described Revolution. how he found records of Wood's in a small church in Vermont. He described Woods move to the Missouri territory establishing an inn and tavern where a then Lieutenant Zachary Taylor (later to become President of the United States) garrisoned his troops on one of their stops to what ultimately became known as the "Battle of New Orleans". appreciation to the Woods' family, Taylor had his troops construct a "Spinning Wheel" for Mrs. Woods. This wheel now resides in the Burnet Historical County Museum, Burnet, Texas. Zadock Woods served in several battles during the Texas Revolution, his last serving as a volunteer with Texas forces against Mexican general Adrián Woll at Salado Creek. On September 18, 1842, Woods was killed in the Dawson Massacre. He was buried in a mass grave near Salado Creek on the east side of San Antonio. Dr. Spellman was presented a Certificate of Appreciation by Chapter President, Rodney Weems.
